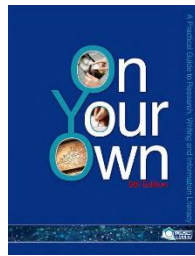

Plagiarism: "to steal and pass off (the ideas or words of another) as one's own : use (another's production) without crediting [citing] the source."
